Choral/ Vocal Studies

Choir

Townsend School of Music offers three performing collegiate choirs, all recognized for their excellence —

- Mercer Singers
- Women's Chamber Choir
- University Choir

In addition to undergraduate preparation in music performance and education, the Choral Studies Area offers a master's degree in choral conducting and a master's degree in sacred music with an emphasis in choral conducting.

Opera

Mercer University Opera allows students to develop as singing actors through stage movement and interpretation techniques. A colorful repertoire of musical theatre — ranging from opera to Broadway musicals — culminate in first-class staged and costumed productions. Recent opera productions have included *Dido and Aeneas*, *The Magic Flute*, *Alcina*, *Oklahoma*, *Little Women, the Musical*, *Nunsense*, as well as other stage and opera revues. The Vocal Studies Area offers a master's degree in performance.



Undergraduate Degrees

Bachelor of Music Education

The Bachelor of Music Education (B.M.E.) provides professional training for students pursuing a career as a public or private school teacher of choral, band, orchestral or elementary general music. B.M.E. majors also earn P - 12 teacher education certification in music in the state of Georgia. Townsend School of Music currently enjoys a high rate of placement of graduates in music teaching positions. This degree is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) and is approved by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GPSC).

Bachelor of Music in Performance

The Bachelor of Music in Performance (B.M.) degree is uniquely designed to allow a student to develop specialized technical skills and knowledge. We make music performance the center of each student's life for the four years in residence. The major areas of applied study include woodwind and brass instruments, percussion, guitar, harp, strings, voice and keyboard (piano, organ and harpsichord).

Bachelor of Music in Music Production

The Bachelor of Music in Music Production degree is designed to prepare a student for a fulfilling career in music production. This degree is unique in that it allows students to learn how to produce musical art in a commercial medium without losing the rigor of a music performance degree. Utilizing the technology resources of Mercer Music at Capricorn, the B.M. in Music Production degree equips students to employ sound technology in the service of live music, recordings, film, events, and more.

Bachelor of Music

with Elective Studies in an Outside Field

The Bachelor of Music with Elective Studies in an Outside Field (B.Mesof) degree is uniquely designed to allow a student to develop highly specialized technical skills and knowledge for an instrument or voice. Excellence as performers is the School's goal for students majoring in this degree. They are held to a high standard of technical ability, artistry and difficulty. In addition, students pursuing this degree will choose an area of elective study outside of music. Various options include: Business, English, Art, Communication, Psychology and Theatre.

Bachelor of Science in Music Business

The Bachelor of Science in Music Business degree prepares students for a successful career working in the music and entertainment management industry. One of the unique features of this degree is the 30 credit hours from the School of Business which facilitates integration of musical knowledge and skill with business savvy and insight.

Bachelor of Arts in Music

The Bachelor of Arts in Music (B.A.) degree is specifically designed to permit a student to concentrate on music within the context of a liberal arts program. The unique feature of this degree allows students ample opportunity to double major or minor in a different field of study and /or concentrate in:

- Composition
- Musicology
- Sacred Music
- Performance
- Production/Technology

Minors offered in the School of Music include Music, Sacred Music and Music Production.



Instrumental Studies

Townsend School of Music's Instrumental Music Program provides a rich music experience through outstanding large ensembles, chamber ensembles, and studio ensembles. These varied experiences are designed to equip students with the artistic tools necessary for the 21st-century musical artist. Each ensemble collaborates with guest artists and the excellent faculty, all focused on helping students achieve musical excellence. The Instrumental Area offers master's degrees in both Wind Band Conducting and Performance.

Keyboard Studies

Piano Studies

Mercer University is an All-Steinway School, through a generous gift by Mercer's chancellor, Dr. R. Kirby Godsey. With the establishment of the Joan Stockstill Godsey Center for Keyboard Studies, Townsend School of Music exclusively features Steinway & Sons pianos for all teaching, rehearsals and performances. The gift enabled the School of Music to join the nation's other premier music programs as an All-Steinway School, provided for 37 new pianos, and created an endowed fund to support their care and upkeep. The Joan Stockstill Godsey Center for Keyboard Studies hosts an annual Concert Series that features leading international performing keyboard artists. The Keyboard Studies Area offers master's degrees in performance and sacred music.



Collaborative Piano

Mercer's Master of Music in Collaborative Piano allows talented pianists who have completed an undergraduate degree in music to enter an intense period of graduate professional study that will prepare them for a career in collaborative piano. This is distinct from an M.M. in Performance in that piano performance study is directed toward solo performance. Collaborative Piano requires a different focus in training, with an emphasis on accompanying and chamber music. Collaborative Piano graduate students choose one of two areas of emphasis: vocal or instrumental music. Advanced private study and literature classes distinguish the areas.

Organ Studies

Organ students study standard repertoire as well as works by women and people of color. Townsend School of Music's collection includes outstanding performance organs by Gonzalez, Holtkamp/Gober/Desautels, Juget-Sinclair, Noack, and Richards, Fowkes & Co., with new organs by François Desautels (2025) and E. M. Skinner (a rebuilt historic instrument, 2027). Local churches also generously offer their organs for student practice and recitals. Courses in service playing skills, improvisation and organ literature are critical elements in the curriculum. Organists also collaborate with outstanding instrumental and voice students and sing in the acclaimed Mercer Singers, preparing organ students for sacred music ministry work.



Strings Studies

Extraordinary string students deserve an extraordinary college experience.

The Robert McDuffie Center for Strings has assembled an unparalleled faculty of international performing artists to teach talented students in pursuit of musical excellence.

Founded as a special institute within Mercer University's Townsend School of Music, the McDuffie Center for Strings' enrollment is limited to 27 students: 12 violinists, six violists, six cellists and three double bassists. Students accepted to the Center receive a full-tuition University scholarship.

A Night of Georgia Music

The distinguished artists of the Center perform, collaborate and record with the finest orchestras, string ensembles and conductors around the world. They are at the top of their fields. Each McDuffie Center student interacts with these distinguished artists on a regular basis, which enhances the student's private lessons, master classes, chamber music coaching sessions and orchestral sectionals, all a part of their required curriculum.

Combining this intensive, conservatory experience with the practicality of a hybrid (music/liberal arts/business) curriculum, the McDuffie Center for Strings prepares the exceptional musician for success in the real world.

Enrichment opportunities abound with the Center for Strings and Townsend School of Music. In past years, students have recorded an album with R.E.M. founding member Mike Mills, filmed *A Grand Mercer Christmas* and Emmy® Award-winning *A Night of Georgia Music* for public television broadcast, and played in Carnegie Hall. All students travel to Rome, Italy, at least once to perform at the Rome Chamber Music Festival. McDuffie graduates are consistently admitted to master's programs at top schools, including Yale, Curtis, the New England Conservatory, Michigan and Juilliard, where two alumni have won prestigious Kovner Fellowships.

Sacred Music Studies

Undergraduate programs in the **Townsend-McAfee Institute for Sacred Music** are honors-level courses of study that connect students to real-world experiences while cultivating critical thinking and research based problem-solving skills. In addition to our classroom seminars, students are also encouraged to experience immersion courses such as ethnographic field-work at U.S.-based music festivals, performance and leadership in local congregations, or service-learning projects such as A Common Refrain in Morocco. Undergraduate programs include:

- Bachelor of Arts with Concentration in Sacred Music
- Minor in Sacred Music
- Certificate in Sacred Music Studies

Our graduate programs are designed for students who are ready for the next level of their Sacred Music education. These rigorous and rewarding programs prepare leaders for a lifetime of service and worship, either as performers and practitioners (performance track) or as scholars and thought leaders (thesis track). For those who are committed to serving in a congregation as a vocation, we offer dual degrees in conjunction with McAfee School of Theology (requires acceptance to both schools). Graduate programs include:

- Master of Music in Sacred Music (Performance or Thesis)
- Master of Sacred Music (low-residency, hybrid)
- Certificate in Sacred Music (low-residency, hybrid)
- Master of Music in Sacred Music/Master of Theological Studies (Dual-Degree with McAfee School of Theology)
- Master of Music in Sacred Music/Master of Divinity (Dual-Degree with McAfee School of Theology)





International Experiences

International Travel

Music students are active in traveling around the world using their musical gifts and talents. Through the University's signature program, Mercer On Mission, music students have the opportunity to share their talents with people of different cultures and traditions. Mercer ensembles travel internationally giving students the opportunity to perform in historic locations across the globe. Most recently, Mercer Singers traveled to Normandy, France, and the Wind Ensemble toured England and Ireland. Students of the Robert McDuffie Center for Strings participate in the annual Rome Chamber Music Festival in Rome, Italy. Music students also travel to participate in international solo festivals and competitions.



Graduate Degrees

The Graduate Studies Program at Mercer's Townsend School of Music prepares musical artists for professional careers in performance, conducting and collaborative piano. In addition, we offer intensive preparation for careers in sacred music ministry through The Townsend-McAfee Institute. If you seek to be a professional conductor, performer, collaborative artist, or sacred music practitioner, we will help you achieve your goals.

Master of Music in Performance

The Master of Music in Performance degree is designed for exceptional musicians who have completed an undergraduate degree in music and wish to pursue intensive graduate studies in solo performance (voice, piano, organ, instrumental).

Master of Music in Collaborative Piano (Vocal or Instrumental)

The Master of Music in Collaborative Piano allows talented pianists who have completed an undergraduate degree in music to enter an intense period of graduate professional study that will prepare them for a career in collaborative piano.

Master of Music in Conducting

The Master of Music in Conducting is designed for exceptional musicians who have completed an undergraduate degree in music and wish to pursue intensive graduate studies in choral or wind band conducting.

Master of Music in Sacred Music

The Master of Music in Sacred Music degree is intended for talented persons who have completed an undergraduate degree in music and who want to enter an intense period of graduate professional study that will prepare them for the practice of sacred music ministry.

Master of Sacred Music (low-residency, hybrid)

The Master of Sacred Music degree is a low-residency, hybrid degree that allows the student to continue serving their local congregation while taking courses online from sacred music professors and fellows from around the world. There are two events on campus that students will attend each year to enhance their education and network in the world of music and worship leadership.

Artist Diploma

The Artist Diploma is a two-year, non-degree program that admits only the artistically gifted and motivated student who has completed a baccalaureate degree in music and has attained a level of artistry commensurate with professional performance standards. The focus of the AD program is to achieve the highest level of performance and to allow the student to develop in both creativity and professionalism.
